About Northwest Catholic High School

Northwest Catholic High School is the school where you know you belong. It is located in the beautiful town of West Hartford, CT, ranked #15 in Best Places to Live in the U.S. Since its dedication on September 24, 1961, it has been maintained in the Catholic educational tradition and has been home to a vibrant, diverse, academically-driven, service-oriented community forming young men and women into leaders who view their gifts and talents as meaningful expressions of faith. Students are challenged to embrace diversity and pursue excellence, and graduates measure success by how deeply they have rooted their lives in service that promotes justice in an increasingly complex global society. For three years in a row, NWC has been ranked #1 Catholic School in Hartford County.

The school is accredited by the New England Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools (NEASC) and the Connecticut State Department of Education and is an active member of the Connecticut Association of Independent Schools, NCEA, NAIS, SACD, NASSP, and CAS.

NWC offers a comprehensive and challenging academic program, including 17 Advanced Placement courses. With the help of experienced counselors, students build an ambitious course of study. 98% of NWC graduates continue on to colleges and universities across the country, many with merit-based scholarships, highlighting the degree of preparation and quality of instruction offered at the School. Faith and service at NWC grow out of its rigorous academic program and focus on leadership formation.

The President reports to the Archdiocesan Office of Education, Evangelization & Catechesis and leads an advisory board comprised of 11 dedicated individuals who provide guidance and recommendations relative to Catholic mission, recruitment, advancement, finance, strategic planning, and governance.


The core of the course of study at Northwest Catholic includes English, Fine Arts, Mathematics, Religion, Physical Education, Religion, Science, Social Studies, and World Languages. There are 17 AP and 37 Honors courses available to students.

The school also incorporates leadership development and Christian service into the curriculum through the LEADS program (Leadership, Engagement, Accountability, Determination, and Service) and classes like ACTS, A Chance to Serve, and the Honors Institute for Leadership in Life (HILL). The goal is to prepare NWC students to be leaders of high moral character, guided by their faith, prepared to serve God and others.

Spirituality, Campus Ministry, and Christian Service

NWC provides a unique educational experience steeped in tradition and based on values. Students are encouraged to know, love, and serve God, to follow Jesus, to love others as Jesus loves them, and to empower others to do the same. Fine and Performing Arts

Northwest Catholic's Fine & Performing Arts Program rivals the largest public and private schools in the State. Whether it is in the classroom, with 28 courses to choose from, or after school, with clubs ranging from Dramateurs to Muse, Northwest Catholic invites students to pursue their interests in the fine and performing arts.

Eight experienced faculty members, all professionals in their fields, champion the arts at NWC and guide students, beginner to expert.

Athletics, Clubs, and Activities

Northwest Catholic has a long and proud history as an athletic powerhouse. With 47 State Championships on the books, Northwest Catholic carries on the tradition of sportsmanship and success.



NWC athletics emphasizes sacrifice, self-discipline, and dedication. Student-athletes demonstrate good sportsmanship, emotional control, dependability, and respect. Through sports, they learn about cooperation, decision-making, and healthy living. Most important, studentathletes learn how to work with peers from all walks of life. Students may choose from 20 interscholastic athletic sports. Since 2010, almost 200 student-athletes have graduated from NWC and gone on to compete at the collegiate level.

Northwest Catholic offers 26 after-school clubs and activities that enhance the student experience and offers eleven summer sports camps that keep the campus abuzz year-round.

Opportunities and Challenges

This is an exciting time for Northwest Catholic High School. The school is currently celebrating its 60th anniversary with enthusiastic alumni and community support. The current leadership team has conducted a full mission and strategic planning review of all levels of the institution. This two-year process has resulted in a clear statement of mission, values, graduate profile, and strategic and master plan of facilities.

Opportunities and Challenges (CONTINUED)

The school is in the fourth year of a promising five year plan, and key indicators are trending upward. An immediate strategic opportunity is the ten-year NEASC accreditation, which will allow the community to validate its mission in self-study.

As it enters its 60th anniversary, there is a felt sense of turning toward a new era of opportunity and development. The next President will be building on a solid foundation and Catholic brand.

The next President of Northwest Catholic will inherit a community that has a strong sense of its mission and vision and who are ready to take the school to the next level of excellence. The next President of Northwest will require discipline and focus and a commitment to securing all necessary resources to make the extraordinary outcomes of the strategic and master plans possible. Fundraising and advancement of the school in the marketplace will, therefore, be a top priority in the coming years. The NWC board and the Archdiocese of Hartford are fully prepared to support this effort.

NWC has developed a preliminary case for an extremely compelling capital campaign for the 60th anniversary of the school. The school received its single largest gift of \$1 million this past summer in anticipation of the 60th anniversary and to secure operational vitality. The school has a mature base of alumni benefactors and advisors who stand at the ready to support a vibrant new President and Head of the School.

The next President of NWC will have an opportunity to preside over an era of visionary development and growth in ensuring the future, forming the whole person, and enhancing the campus. This is a rare and exceptional opportunity to raise the profile and value proposition of Northwest Catholic High School and to reinforce the school's Catholic mission as a high performing, welcoming, and diverse college preparatory environment.

- · A faith-filled practicing Catholic with vision and energy who will embrace and promote the school's powerful Catholic mission, values, and traditions while modeling those values in his/her daily leadership practice is required.
- A mission-driven leader with a demonstrated understanding, respect, and support for the critical role Catholic schools play in the evangelizing mission of the Church and the significant impact Catholic education has on students, their families, and their communities.
- · A high-profile, relational manager who will serve as the outward-facing leader and chief advancement officer of the school, elevating its profile, advancing its mission, managing its business and financial matters, increasing its endowment, improving its infrastructure, and executing its comprehensive strategic and master plans.
- A commitment to academic excellence.
- A commitment to student diversity, equity, and inclusion.

This is a time of great promise for NWC. The board welcomes candidates from other Catholic or independent schools as well as accomplished professionals from other mission-critical career venues such as higher-education, non-profit foundations, associations, charities, and the like; as well as other corporate, civic, and professional services arenas.
